Writing for Children

No kind of writing lodge itself so deeply in our memory, echoing there for the rest of our lives, as the books that we met in our childhood... To enter and hold the mind of a child or a young person is one of the hardest of all writers' tasks.

E.B. White asserts:

- Any one who writes down to children is simply wasting his time.
 You have to write up, not down...
- Some writers for children deliberately avoid using words they think a child doesn't know.
- Children love words that give them a hard time, provided they are in a context that absorbs their attention



• The uniqueness of children's literature, then, lies on the audience that it addresses.

- Authors of children's books are circumscribed only by the experiences of childhood, but these are vast and complex.
- Children think and feel; they wonder and they dream. Much is known, but little is explained.



Criteria for writing children's book

Topic: 1) experiences of childhood set in the past, present, or future (e.g., enjoying birthday parties, anticipating adulthood, getting a new pet, enduring siblings, and dealing with family situations); 2) things that are of interest to children

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Manner: 1) stories are told in a forthright, humorous, or suspenseful manner (stories that are told in **nostalgic or overly** sentimental terms are **inappropriate**); 2) stories should emphasize the hope for a better future rather than the

B) Quality

"The best children's books offer readers enjoyment as well as memorable characters and situations and valuable insights into the human condition." Quality of writing: originality and importance of ideas imaginative use of language beauty of literary and artistic style

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Essentials: What is Children's Literature? What is Childhood?

- The study of Children literature involves three elements the literature, the children, and the adult critics
- Definition:
- "Children's literature is good quality trade books for children from birth to adolescence, covering topics of relevance and interests to children of those ages, through prose and poetry, fiction and nonfiction." (p. 3)
- A *trade book*, by design and content, is primarily for the purpose of entertainment and information. Trade books are often referred to as library books and story books. They are different from *textbooks*, which are for the purpose of instruction.

Values of Literature to Children

The critics define their children's literature

• " 'Children's Literature becomes defined as containing, both in form and content, the 'need of children' and, therefore, this is how 'children's books' – written, published, sold, and usually bought, by adults



- Writers have become aware that, for the child, a book is a source of satisfaction that derives from identification and participation, and an expansion of his own experience.
- They provide him with an opportunity for catharsis, self knowledge, and broadening his psychic experience.
