Parallel structure

Parallel structure

(also called **parallelism**) is the repetition of a chosen grammatical form within a **sentence**. By making each compared item or idea in your **sentence** follow the same grammatical pattern, you create a **parallel** construction. This morning I woke up late, couldn't catch the early bus and getting complained by boss.

Everyone loves him because he is both kind and generosity.

Not Parallel:

My best friend took me dancing and to a show.

Parallel:

My best friend took me to a dance and a show.



You can either take a bus or walk to the mall.

He speaks either Chinese or Japanese.



He neither drinks nor smokes.
