### **Course Description**

This course is designed to improve and develop student's four English Skills: listening to official announcement, presentation, advertisement and reviews; expressing opinion,; reviewing, criticizing, and making comparison and contrast; speaking in meeting; classroom presentation; reading and analyzing message, advertisement; article, book and textbook; writing complex sentence; writing essay and full report; writing future plan; writing to express opinion and feeling in various occasions

### **Course Objectives**

- 2. listen for academic topics comprehensively;
- 3. present and think critically to help students engage with the topic intellectually;
- 4. read for comprehension and identify the main idea and details correctly;
- 5. write paragraphs with correct words and grammatical accuracy.

2. listen for main ideas, rhetorical questions, summaries, facts and opinions, and similarities and differences;
